

Cherokee High School Dual Enrollment Information

Dual Enrollment is a program offered by the state of Georgia that allows high school students to attend college classes and earn both college and high school credit. Students in this program are eligible for free tuition, fees, and books.

***NEW LEGISLATION = Students are limited state funding for up to 30 credit hours (Most college classes are 3 credits each). 11th and 12th-grade students are eligible. 9th-grade students no longer eligible. 10th-grade students eligible on a limited basis based on test scores and type of classes.

1. Research college options. Check the college website and pay close attention to deadlines. **Some colleges require SAT/ACT scores so plan accordingly to take a test well ahead of deadlines.** Other colleges allow you to take their placement test instead.
2. Follow all dual enrollment admissions procedures for the college of your choice.
3. Schedule an **individual appointment** with your school counselor. This is a mandatory meeting and individual graduation requirements will be discussed. Please bring any paperwork from the college that requires a high school counselor's signature. You will also turn in the [CCSD Dual Enrollment Participation Form](#). It is fine to use the 2020-21 form. This form must be turned into the school counselor by the CCSD deadline (4/1 for Fall enrollment) regardless of the college deadline.
4. Once accepted to the college of your choice, follow the college's orientation and class registration procedures.
5. Give a copy of your college schedule to your school counselor at the high school.
