Top Four SEL Priorities for 2020_21 School Year

- Staff Care and Self Care
 - SEL Sunshine Committee
 - Had events throughout the year to spread joy to the faculty consisting of treat bags, donut delivery, and so much more.
 - SEL Café will return next year for teachers to be able to purchase breakfast and lunch items; this year we had limited offerings due to COVID.
- Student Supports
 - We shared that we had 12 students and 11 mentors at Hasty involved in the Check and Connect Program to promote student and family engagement with school.
 - We discussed our Care Team and how it supports our students.
 - Counseling groups were shared with how they strive to support our students and their diverse needs.
 - Restorative practices were discussed and the CCSD YouTube page was shared for Parent University links.
- Wellness Initiatives
 - We shared a multitude of ways our faculty sought to encourage wellness among our students consisting of weekly videos created for our students by our specials teachers for Wellness Wednesdays, physically active pack parties, art club increased membership, garden club, and so much more!
 - Additionally, we shared how we have worked to increase the commitment of our faculty through Wellness Wednesday faculty activities such as Pilates, mindfulness, step challenges, and so much more!
- Social-Emotional Learning
 - Morning Meetings began in all classrooms this year, and we worked to incorporate the different components of greeting, sharing, activity, and morning message. Teachers shared testimonial videos, and we look forward to having a full 20 minutes next year each day instead of ten to allow us to incorporate in each component daily.
 - Additionally, CCSD will be releasing two SEL lessons for each month to use with students in each grade level.

 - Monthly recognitions of one student per grade level and one teacher for the school will continue next year in line with character words.
